The Shrewd Manager

Luke 16:10 "Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with very much and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much."

One of the strangest parables in the gospels is the one with the dishonest manager. His employer accused him of wasting his possessions and let him know that he was about to lose his job. He reasoned within himself that he was not strong enough to dig and too ashamed to beg. What could he do in order to survive? He decided to make people appreciate him once he was relieved of his job. As the debtors came to him one by one, he reduced the amount that they owed his manager. The bill was reduced as much as one-half for some of the debtors. They became indebted to the manager and were a friend to him for life.

What is the meaning of this parable? Is Jesus commending the dishonest behavior of this man? There are two thoughts that this parable intended to convey. First, the manager thought about his future. He made plans through these debtors in order to survive. Jesus intends for us to think of our future. This world is not all about the plans for today. Yes, we must eat and drink today. We must work to provide the income needed to survive on a daily basis but we are also to live each day planning for our eternity. Eternity is coming! Will we be ready?

Secondly, if we are to be trustworthy in handling true riches, we must show that we are trustworthy in handling worldly wealth. Jesus is warning us to use our worldly wealth properly so that we will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. Are you using your worldly wealth wisely? Let's show ourselves faithful and trustworthy stewards who are planning for our eternal future with the Lord
