In Joshua chapter six, Israel has begun to enter into the Promised Land and defeats their first obstacle, the mighty city of Jericho. God proved through great and powerful ways He was fighting for them. However, they were not allowed to loot the city in any way. Everything of value was placed under a ban to be dedicated to the Lord.

In chapter seven, they come against the small city of Ai and rightly expect to swiftly defeat them. Upon beginning the attack they are repelled and quickly retreat when several of them are killed. When Joshua and the elders turn to God about this, it is revealed there is sin among them. Someone (whom we later learn is Achan) has taken some things under the ban and hidden them among his own possessions. When this is ultimately found out, Achan, his family all his possessions are stoned and burned with fire (Jos. 7:24-25).

If we back up a few verses, we see God declares He will not be with Israel unless they destroy the things under the ban from their midst (Jos. 7:12). How often are we held back from victories in life and keep God away from us because of sin? How often are we like Achan as we try to hide sin in our midst, thinking no one else knows while forgetting God does? How many sins are we keeping secret out of fear of embarrassment, shame, possible jail time, losing a relationship, etc. . .? While these fears are very real and have a powerful way of keeping sin hidden, the truth is they also keep God away from us and prevent us from being what we should and could be.

Another important truth we learn is, sin has consequences that can and do reach far beyond ourselves. Thirty-six people were dead because of Achan. Achan, his family and livestock were killed also. Hidden sin will always force us to pay a price we never wanted to (Rm. 6:23). The good news is since Jesus has shed His blood so we don't have to. 'If we confess our sins, (even the hidden ones) He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 Jn. 1:9).
