Earlier this week the world received the news about the tragic death of a beloved comedy icon, Robin Williams. Because he was so much more than a comedian, he was known for his dramatic roles, voice talents and generosity towards several charities he worked with. As the details surrounding his death unfolded, we quickly learned it was suicide. Williams had reportedly suffered from mental illness which included Bi-Polar depression. We never know what burdens others are bearing or the pain they are hiding. We often put on our happy face at church and act like all is well even when it is not. Through the mutual care and concern God expects from His people toward one another, we can all have a lasting impact and godly influence upon the lives of others. It requires two things: 1. You have to be willing to put yourself out there and let your love and concern be known. 2. You have to be willing to let others know what you are facing and allow them to help.

Are You Gentle?...Joe Macer

Philippians 4:5 Let your gentleness be evident to all.

The Lord is near

As he came into Jerusalem, he was described as gentle and riding on a donkey. Why be gentle? The reason supplied in this verse is because the Lord is near. We would disappoint the Lord by not responding with gentleness. If the Lord would return, we would not want to be found with a violent, hateful spirit.

Another reason is that an attitude that is less than gentle will turn people away from the Lord. Peter reminded Christians to always be ready to give a reason for the hope that they have but they were to do it with gentleness and respect. Harshness will prevent one from having an audience. May we all examine ourselves for a spirit of gentleness and if we are found lacking then strive to improve in this area.
