Nehemiah 8:3 And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Israel called for an assembly of the people at the Water Gate. Ezra was asked to bring out the Book of the Law of Moses. At daybreak Ezra began reading to those assembled. A platform had been built and Ezra was standing on it so that all could see him and hear him. As he began to read, the people stood on their feet and listened to him until noon. Not only did Ezra read the Scriptures but he also made it clear and gave the meaning of what he read. "And all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law." They had a deep desire to know what God wanted and expected of them.

The assembly happened during the month of October or possibly November. From sun up to noon would be approximately five hours.
