This week I am at the 35th year of Horizons. It is a future church leaders workshop at Freed Hardeman University. The goal of this week is to train young men and women to be leaders in the Lord's church. There are over 1000 people here and it is an amazing camp. We are discussing the sermon on the mount with the theme "Inside Out". We are studying Jesus' instructions that show how God is concerned with more than our actions. Revelation 22:14 Blessed are those who wash their robes, that they may have the right to the tree of life and may go through the gates into the city.

This is the seventh and final blessing recorded in the book of Revelation. Two blessings come to those who have washed their robes. What is meant by this phrase? It is used one other time in this book. Revelation 7:14 states, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." A robe refers to our lives and in Scripture dirty clothes represents sin. We must have sin removed from our lives. The verse following this blessing states sins that if they are not removed will prevent them from this blessing. The act of baptism washes away our sins. Baptism is a decision we make to obey the Lord but the blood that Jesus shed on the cross is what pays the price for our sins and cleanses us of our sin. Dirty clothes dipped in the blood of Christ are now white. As Christians, the blood of Jesus continues to cleanse us of our sins.

What are the blessings of having our robes washed? Two are listed in this verse. First, we have the right to the tree of life. The tree of life represents eternal life. Christians have the right to eternal life. What a tremendous blessing! The second blessing is we are able to go through the gates into the city. What city? We are able to enter heaven itself - the home of God! Think about how important the blood of Christ is to our salvation and how important that we obey the gospel by washing our sins away in baptism. Will you be blessed with eternal life and with a home in heaven? The Lord gave his blood and his life so that you can enjoy these blessings.
