A Unified Body

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" ²² On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, ²⁴ while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, ²⁵ so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. I Corinthians 12:21-26

This month as we focus on a biblical view of membership we will look at a number of characteristics of a healthy church and none is more important than unity. There are few things more damaging to the Lord's work than a division among God's people. One of the 7 things that God hates is "one who sows discord among brethren" Proverbs 6:19. That is why it is so important that we all work toward those things that lead to unity of the Spirit in a bond of peace Ephesians 4:3. I believe a greater understanding of our need for each other and our role within the body of Christ should always lead to a greater measure of unity within His church.

When Paul paints his picture of the Lord's church in I Corinthians 12, he points out a few things that will help us be better members of the body. First, we must realize we all need each other. Secondly, he emphasizes that every part is vital to the body. Finally he shows us that God is the one who has put the body together and that is why we must avoid divisions and show equal concern for each other. If we can do these things we will be a strong church for the Lord.

A Little Advice

Ecclesiastes 5:1 Guard your steps when you go to the house of God. Go near to listen rather than to offer the sacrifice of fools, who do not know that they do wrong.

What is your attitude as you enter the building to worship God? Solomon is delivering a message: If you are going to take the time to worship God, then make sure you are doing it correctly. Wise men seek to find out what God wants while a foolish man does not care but simply does what he wants. Guard your steps. Think about what you are doing. Solomon advised us to go into the house of God to listen. When songs are sung do we really hear the message? When the Scriptures are read do we really hear what God is saying to us? When the sermon is delivered do we take it personally? We are to have a heart that is seeking a message that will draw us closer to God and his will.

People often enter the doors thinking they are sacrificing their time, money and possessions to please God. They consider that a sacrifice makes everything right. Jesus talked on occasions about vain worship. Sacrifices made without proper attitudes and motives are not pleasing to God. Sacrifices made without knowledge and truth are repulsive as well. Often these individuals think they have pleased God and yet they are wrong. We would do well to listen to other words of wisdom from Solomon. The following verse concludes by saying, "God is in heaven and you are on earth, so let your words be few." Let's guard our steps when we go to worship.
