Due to the growing nature of our work our elders have determined it is necessary to raise our weekly budget as was announced at the beginning of this year. It is not due solely to the responsibility of paying for this building, but it is due to a continued desire to increase our works and thus the impact we have upon the world through them. When I first met with this eldership to interview for the preaching position, I was informed not one dollar was cut from funding anything they were currently doing to pay for a new building. Instead they actually increased and expanded the budget for mission works and other related ministries. I am proud to say, to this day over three years later they have kept their word and proven most responsible with the Lord's money. Because of these new horizons and opportunities before us it is all the more necessary each of us do what we can to ensure we are doing our part. On an individual/ family level, it comes out to be a little as \$5-10 per week consistently. I know some cannot give anymore because of limited income but I also know others can give more than this. The truth is when everyone does a little, it helps a lot.

Making It Clear

Nehemiah 8:8 They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people could understand what was being read.

A high priority for Christians is to read and study the Word of God. Through study we develop an understanding of what God desires for us in our daily lives and his expectations concerning salvation. Scriptures confirm that our faith is built up and grows by spending time in God's word. Learning about God and how he has dealt with people is a blessed privilege. In Nehemiah, the Jewish people have nearly forgotten all that the Law taught. Ezra simply begins by reading God's word from daybreak until noon. This was a moving day since they just did not know what God had wanted any longer. Mourning and weeping occurred as the word was read. The audience was told to rejoice because they had heard God's word.

In Nehemiah's time as well as today the purpose of a religious speaker is to make God's word clear. Some in Ezra's audience did not understand everything and Ezra along with some Levites explained the meaning. This is the work of today's preacher as well. Another thing that Christians can do is to read good books and commentaries. We must never forget that these are written by men and are not inspired but they may benefit our understanding. I research many resources each time that I present a lesson. I encourage you to take advantage of our library found in room C-9. A special thank you goes out to Greg for building the shelving. Some of our ladies organized and placed the books on the shelves. Take advantage of this opportunity to study any one of the many books, commentaries or themes presented in these books within our library.
