Mary Regina "Granny" Keller, was quite a remarkable lady. She was always glad to see you and made you feel special with her warm hugs and kind words. She came closer than most people I know to truly loving everyone. For example even after one of her daughters went through a bitter divorce, she still treated her former son-in-law with love and kindness. For all of her years of life experience she was full of wisdom and advice. After living 90 years, being married for 60, raising 9 children, with a total of 24 grandchildren, 40 great-grandchildren and 1 great-great-grandchild and being a successful business woman, surely you know something about life.

At her funeral the following things were listed on the back of a handout. Each one as far as I know is from her own pen. It is entitled, "The Legacy Granny would like to leave with you is: We are all on a journey. God did not intend for this world to be the best of all places, but a place where we can prepare for the best, our heavenly home. Life is a gift from God, what you do with it is your gift to Him. The most important thing in life is relationships, your relationship with God and with each other. Life is full of choices, chose to be happy. There is nothing that is going to happen today that you and God can't handle. Be a giver of your money, talent and time. You can't bless others without getting blessed yourself. Find ways to be an encourager, a kind word, a helping hand, a phone call, a card or note, so many ways to say I care. Be happy, it doesn't depend upon things. It's that inner peace you have in your soul, when all is well with you and your relationship with God, your family and those your life touches. If you want your married life to be happy, nurture it as a gift from God. It is no longer "me" but "us". You are called to be helpmates on your journey back to your heavenly home. Hug your child, tell them you love them. Be patient, remember you are the parent and you have lived longer. God has given you wisdom to deal with each situation. Be an encourager, they are not a carbon copy of you. God doesn't make clones, each is different and special. I know what you are thinking. . . I'm glad He didn't make but one Granny.

Time and space will not permit me to say much more about Granny. However, because she truly loved and lived life and knew what was most important, she left a great legacy that will not be soon forgotten. What kind of legacy will you and I leave behind?

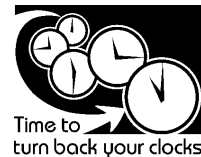

Summits of the Psalms

Psalm 94

94:17 Unless the Lord had given me help, I would soon have dwelt in the silence of death.

“O Lord, how long will the wicked be jubilant?” The Psalmist called upon God – the avenger and judge – to act on behalf of his people. The writer had seen the murder of widows, aliens and the fatherless. He had heard the taunts of the wicked who claimed that God cannot see or know. The first seven verses are a prayer for God to act on behalf of his people.

Verses 8 – 11 were a call upon the wicked to consider their understanding of God. The Creator made the ear and he can hear. The Creator made the eye and he can see. God, who made the mind, knows the thoughts of men. He had punished before and they were warned that he would do so again. Evil always has its consequences.

The author in verses 12 – 15 reassured his people that they were being disciplined. When troubles come our way we find out much about our character. Their troubles would bring blessings and they would open their minds to God’s law. Times were tough but God would not reject his people. All of God’s judgments would be based upon righteousness.

In the final verses, the Psalmist declared God to be his rock and his fortress. When he felt as if death were close he knew God was his help. When he felt his foot slipping he felt the love of God. When his mind was full of worries, he felt the joy of God within his soul. May we also stand upon this solid rock and see the workings of God within our lives.
