### How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

There are many Old Testament characters that we admire and who are worthy of our emulation. One that is easily at the top the list is Caleb. You remember that he was one of the twelve spies Moses sent into the Promised Land to "spy out the land." They were told to see what the land was like, what the people were like and to bring back some of the fruit of the land. When they returned all agreed the land was just as God said it was, a land flowing with milk and honey. But ten of the twelve said the people were giants and they could not take the land. Only Joshua and Caleb said that the land could be taken because God was with them (Num.13).

As a result, the nation as a whole refused to listen to Joshua and Caleb and instead of entering the land, they wandered in the wilderness of Sinai for some forty years until all of the ones who failed to believe God ages twenty and up had all died. Soon after that unfaithful generation died, Israel was finally ready and able to enter into the land of Canaan (Num. 14:26-38).

Some forty-five years after he was sent to spy out the land, Caleb comes to Joshua and reminds him that Moses had promised him a portion of the Promised Land. It was not the well watered plain, but it was the mountain of Hebron. But Caleb said to Joshua, "give me this mountain" (Jos. 14:6-15). It mattered not to Caleb that the cities there were fortified and the giants they so feared forty years ago were still there. He wanted the mountain for his inheritance in the land. He knew he could take it for the same reason he had said forty-five years before that Israel could take the land. God would be with him (Jos. 14, 15). In the end Caleb was successful and took the mountain because of his continued trust in God (Num. 14:14).

We all face mountains in our lives. Some are higher than others. Some are harder to take than others. Nevertheless when we trust in God and His help and prove our trust by faithfully following Him with our whole heart, like Caleb, we can conquer any mountain. What mountain do you need to conquer with the Lord's help? It matters not that it is a mountain and the giants are there. If we are faithful God will help us take that mountain.

# Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 65

65:2 O you who hear prayer, to you all men will come.
