On Monday, John Thomas and I, along with about 50 other brethren, attended the 2nd Annual Graymere Preaching Workshop. Last year we spent the whole day studying the book of Matthew and this year we studied Romans. This was not your typical verse by verse or chapter by chapter study. Instead we look at major issues concerning the historical background, the authorship, preaching difficult texts and a few other topics. The aim was to have a very in depth overview of the book of Romans and better equip preachers in teaching and preaching from this book. Overall both workshops have been such a blessing to me.

I have been a serious student of the Bible for nearly my entire adult life. I have read the Bible cover to cover several times, I have taught many Bible classes, preached hundreds of sermons. I have preached through and taught from several books and doing so have read and studied deeply in those books (e.g., John, Mark, Philippians, etc. . .). However, at the end of the day, I know, not only do I have much to learn, I am amazed at how much there is to know about God's word. You can never learn it all or know it all. Each of the men who presented at both of these workshops have studied deeper, longer and far more than I have. They truly are experts on these subjects and Bible Scholars. Yet, they all concluded the same thing and agreed with the Apostle Paul.

"Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and unfathomable His ways! For WHO HAS KNOWN THE MIND OF THE LORD, OR WHO BECAME HIS COUNSELOR? Or WHO HAS FIRST GIVEN TO HIM THAT IT MIGHT BE PAID BACK TO HIM AGAIN? For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever. Amen. (Rm. 11:33-36).

Let's never come to God's Word with the attitude I already know it all or there is not much more to learn. Instead why not challenge yourself to dig deeper into God's word and move beyond the superficial understanding many of us have and seek the riches, wisdom and knowledge of God? The results will amaze and bless you as your faith and dedication grow.

A Continuing Debt

Romans 13:8 "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for he who loves his fellowman has fulfilled the law."

Debts are not enjoyable. Often an item is purchased and it loses its desirability long before the item is paid for completely. Most of us go into debt for a home and it is exciting when it is finally paid in full. Scriptures warn us about going into debt. The borrower becomes a servant to the lender when a loan is taken out. This passage tells us that there is one debt that will never be paid - the debt of love for our fellowman. Having love for our fellowman will result in treating them as we are taught within the Scriptures.
