Set An Example

I Timothy 4:12 Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity.

How young is young? This certainly is a difficult question to answer. Some writers believe Timothy to be in his mid-thirties to mid-forties as Paul writes this verse of encouragement to him. Timothy had an important position and Paul deeply believed in him. Throughout history people have always placed confidence in the older individuals and were suspect of the younger. Apparently even in the first century, Timothy was questioned because of his age. Paul is simply telling Timothy the best way to silence your critics is to live the Christian life to the fullest extent. The same is true today. Whether you are 15, 25, 35 or 45 years old, live the Christian life. Certainly wisdom comes with age and experience but any and all can read the Scriptures and follow the commands of Jesus Christ. It is not really about age but about behavior.

Paul stressed that Timothy needed to set the example. People will be watching especially when you are in a position of leadership. Timothy was to set the example for other Christians. He was to watch carefully what he said and how he said it. His life was to back up the same things he was proclaiming to the believers. Every aspect of his life was to be loving. People easily know if love is a characteristic of a life. People cannot easily be fooled as to your faith. Show them in good times and in hard times your belief in Jesus Christ and the power of salvation. Finally, Timothy was to make sure his life was pure. Nothing has hurt more preachers of the gospel than failure to keep their lives pure. Leadership must set the example but in truth which of these are not required for any Christian? Today, no matter what your age is, set an example for the believers and for those who as of this time have not yet believed.
