One Verse At A Time

By: Joe Macer Perfectly United I Corinthians 1:10

I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and body.

The Corinthian church had many problems and distractions. There was a lack of unity among its members and this is the very first problem that the Apostle Paul addressed. When Christians are united upon God's words then most problems are immediately solved. The Corinthians were arguing among themselves. They were divided into ranks based upon whose teaching they were following. Some followed Paul, other Apollos, still others Cephas and of course Jesus Christ. Paul, Apollos and Cephas all followed Jesus which means that all three were preaching the same message. The allegiance of the Corinthians should have simply been to the Lord Jesus Christ. The following of preachers was undermining the unity within the congregation. Paul firmly states there should be no divisions among the Corinthian Christians.

Christians are to be perfectly united in mind and in thought. What is the meaning of this? Christians are to strive for unity and harmony. We should be in agreement in beliefs, standards, attitudes and the principles of spiritual living. There is room for various opinions, personalities, abilities and gifts. All Christians are not a carbon copy of one another but when it comes to doctrine and the teaching of Scriptures, we must be in agreement. Corinthians who disagreed with doctrine, church leadership or policies of spiritual living destroyed their own joy in the Lord as well as the unity in the congregation. So many disagreements could be prevented by not insisting on things being my way. We must put the interests of the Lord and his people above all else. The early church was described as being one in heart and mind. The Corinthians needed this unity and the church today needs the same if we are to make an impact of this lost world
