## How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

From the first time the Apostle Paul first encountered the resurrected Lord (Acts 9) he was a changed man. Paul would never have the same goals or plans in life. From then on his all consuming goal in life was to know Jesus and become more like Him (Phi. 3:10-12). He knew that he would never arrive at that goal in the fullest sense but he was willing to always strive to be more and more like him. It goes without saying this too should be our goal as Christians. While we know this to be true it is not always so in practice. Let's be honest it is not always easy to like Jesus. While there are many obstacles, we can often become our own worst enemies. Over the next few weeks I want to share with you all some ways we can make Paul's goal our own.

It starts with leaving the past behind. Christians are people with a past. Everyone of us has lived a life of sin. We have all done things we do not want others to know about. While some are far worse than others, there is no sliding scale with God. Sin is sin and all sin leads to death (Rm. 6:23). Far too often, many Christians cannot put the past behind them. They let it paralyze them and keep this from moving forward. Eventually, this becomes an excuse and crutch for them to not do more and be more than they can and should be. Paul lets us know where we should leave the past. "Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Phi. 3:14-15). This requires us to leave sin behind. No, we can never leave it behind in the absolute sense, but we stop the deliberate practice of it and change our lives to do better. We can never become all God wants us to be if we continue living in sin (Rm. 6:11-15). We also need to leave the guilt of sin behind. When we don't, we let the guilt overwhelm us, we question our salvation. We do not feel forgiven. But God assures us we are. Take the time to read for yourself the language God uses to describe His forgiveness (Is. 38:17, 1:18; Mic. 7:19; Ps. 103:12).

In addition, to leave the past behind, we cannot dwell upon our past accomplishments or the good of others. We cannot say, "I used to be more involved". "I used to attend each week". "My parents were such faithful people." Paul certainly gave up his past accomplishments (Phi. 3:4-6) in light of following Christ, he was willing to count them as a loss if it meant knowing Him more (Phi. 3:7-8).

Are you leaving the past behind?

#### **Are Your Treasures Worth It?**

Proverbs 10:2 "Ill-gotten treasures are of no value, but righteousness delivers from death."

We live in a society that believes that wealth has great advantages. With this line of reasoning, many decide to do what is unlawful and immoral in order to gain this wealth. This line of thinking is evil and not well thought out. If a man were to steal a Picasso painting from a museum, where would he display it? If a woman were to take a beautiful diamond necklace belonging to another, where would she wear it? Men often plot how to take money from companies, clients or an individual. They may have the money and think they enjoy the money but what is on their mind when they lay their heads on their pillow at night? Ill-gotten treasures do not provide any security. These possessions very rarely bring any happiness. In each of these illustrations the individual is looking over their shoulder looking for the authorities to come. One more question should be considered as well. What if I come to the end of my life and no man has figured out what I have done? I will die with this item still in my possession and I must face God with this theft on my life's record. I recently read of a hunter that in the 1960's poached three elk. Just weeks ago he called a game warden to ask what the penalty was for this act. His answer was \$250 per animal in the 1960's but today it was \$2000. He was shocked to receive a check in the mail for \$6000. For over 50 years this man was haunted by his lawbreaking.

Righteousness is the path to life and peace and we would be wise to seek it in all that we do.
