When I was 18, I had a steady part-time job. For the past few years I had been driving around in an old Chevy Camaro Z-28. In 1983 this was a really nice car, but by the time I got it, it was far past its prime. The T-tops leaked, so every time it rained I had my own personal puddle in the privacy of the drivers seat. Soon I put duck tape on the roof and took care of the leaks. The radio did not work and the air-conditioner was long gone also. The paint had faded and the interior was basically rotten. The engine needed some work and lets not forget the fact it loved gas. Fortunately at that time gas was about \$1.00 a gallon. Needless to say this thing repelled any and every girl within a 5 mile radius.

After several months of working and proving myself to my dad, the car that was bought as a means of transportation, was finally going to be replaced. Soon I found a very nice used truck. This truck was in great shape, had nice shinny paint, no leaks, low mileage and was easy on gas. There was only one problem, I had no credit. My dad of course co-signed for me and thus my personal credit history began.

Credit scores are important. Your credit score will determine what you can purchase (a house, car, boat, computer, etc. . .) and what kind of interest rate you will have to pay. It is unfortunate when you ruin your credit (no matter what the circumstances are) it can take years to fix.

In a commercial a few years ago for "Free Credit Report.com" a guy is singing about how his credit was bad and he did not even know. But if he had gone to "Free Credit Report.com" his circumstances would have been much different. Is it not wonderful to think God does not require a credit report to determine your salvation? If God were to check your "spiritual credit" would He not find that we all have fallen far short of what He expects and desires because of sin (Rm.3:23)? All would fail to even qualify for salvation. What man could not and can not do because of sin, God did sending His own Son to pay the debt of sin owed by every man (Heb. 2:9; Jn. 3:16). Because of the death of Christ, God is able to freely offer salvation to all who will accept it. The price has already been paid, it is up to you to take it or leave it (Rev 22:17). Despite the darkness of your past and the problems you have encountered, there is no sin too big for God to forgive. Simply put, God can and will fix/repair bad "spiritual credit" (Isa 1:18-20). No matter how high the debt of your sin is, God has already paid the price for it. It is up to you to accept it and allow it to be credited to your account. The only condition to qualify is the willingness to lovingly and humbly obey Him (Rom 6:23).

Put Your House In Order

Isaiah 38:10 I said, "In the prime of my life must I go through the gates of death and be robbed of the rest of my years?

Hezekiah was the king of Judah. The nation had been threatened by the Assyrian Empire but God had miraculously delivered them from this threat. Hezekiah must have been in good spirits and thrilled that God was with him. Time continued to pass and it was as if he was on the top of the world. Hezekiah awoke one day very ill. Isaiah the prophet arrived to tell him to "Put your house in order, because you are going to die; you will not recover." This was greatly disturbing to Hezekiah. He pleaded for his life and reminded God of his faithful service to him. God heard his prayer and saw his tears. Isaiah was sent with the message that God had given him fifteen more years of life. The verse above is the first of many that express Hezekiah's thoughts during this time. Hezekiah felt robbed when he heard his life was about to be cut short.

Are we ever ready for death? What is the prime of life? We think of a teenager, one in the twenties or the thirties as in their prime. As one in the fifties, much is still expected in life. Life is uncertain and death can come in the early or later years. Never forget that God only let his Son live until his early thirties.
