Betraval

Luke 22:48 but Jesus asked him, "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss?"

From the time of Jesus' arrest until his crucifixion various reactions were displayed towards him. Perhaps none were more hurtful than what Judas Iscariot did. Judas had spent quite some time in training with the Lord. Day in and day out he saw the miracles performed by the Lord; he heard the teachings of love and compassion. Judas knew and believed Jesus' claim of being the Son of God. Even though he lived with the Lord around three years, he made the decision to turn him over to the authorities for thirty pieces of silver. Judas betrayed the Lord and even more insulting was that he did it with a kiss.

A kiss is a sign of affection or love to us. In that time, a kiss meant something similar to a hand shake today. We don't extend our hand to our enemies. We shake hands with those we have some type of a relationship with or are just being introduced in order to start a relationship. It would not cross our minds to shake someone's hand in order to set them up for an execution but this is what Judas did. Judas acted as a friend but he was an enemy. The question for each of us as a Christian is, "Are we acting as a friend to the Lord but in reality betraying him?" We may do this with our speech or with our actions. Jesus does expect total dedication. Let's examine our actions and see if any of them are a sign of betrayal. We will look at some other reactions to Jesus at this critical time in his life the next few weeks.
