## How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

This past week we have seen a lot of crazy weather. There was lots of rain over the weekend with some mild flooding. Slightly further north some areas were blanketed in snow. The cold air and moisture combo missed us. Early this week lots of rain turned to ice and led to a snow day. My kids were a bit confused about it being called a snow day and the lack of snow but I think they quickly got over it.

I recalled living through two major ice storms in my life. The first I am sure many of you remember, came in 1994. It led to massive damage and power outages for weeks in some places. The last one was when I was living in Kentucky in January of 2009. The previous September we had been hit by a major windstorm which brought hurricane force winds (90mph. recorded at Louisville's airport) and as you can imagine lots of damage. Just when most of the area had barely recovered from that the ice storm came. There were two consecutive nights of freezing rain. We lost power the second night. When it was over there was about an inch or more of ice everywhere. But the saving grace was after the second night about four inches of snow fell and made it possible to travel cautiously. At that time Ethan and Austin were five and two and Amanda was almost nine months pregnant with Logan. When the power went out we were stuck very unprepared. We had only one or two flashlights, a few small candles, no phone service, electricity or heat. I was so afraid we would have to deliver a baby at home. By the next afternoon when it was obvious the power was not coming on anytime soon, we headed south to stay with my in-laws in Lewisburg. We went home a few days later with a generator in tow and the power came back on in within a few days. Now what did I learn from all of this?

- Be prepared. Life has a way of catching us unprepared. While we were never in any life threatening danger, we easily could have been. We never know what tomorrow will bring (Jm. 4:13-17) so we especially need to be prepared toward God (Amos 4:12).
- Life is uncontrollable. There was nothing I could do to prevent or stop this ice storm, it was totally beyond anyone's control. We all like to think we are in control of our lives, so we plan and do accordingly but we all know this is not the case. With this knowledge and acceptance of it in mind, trusting God and His will for our lives is even more important.

God works in our lives in some incredible ways. Looking back there are several times I can see God's hand at work. The snow made it possible to leave. We did not have a baby at home. Our safety was never compromised, just to name a few.

## **One Verse At A Time** By: Joe Macer My Words

Matthew 24:35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.

Since the days in which the New Testament was being written and combined into the form we know it as today, it has been attacked.

In 303 A. D. the emperor Diocletian issued a royal decree that every Bible should be destroyed Diocletian went on to say that if one had a copy of the Scriptures and did not surrender it to be burned, if it were discovered, he would be killed. Furthermore, if any other should know of one who had a copy of the Scriptures, and did not report it, he also would be killed. As a result many Bibles were burned and many Christians were executed. After this edict had been in force for two years, Diocletian boasted, "I have completely exterminated the Christian writings from the face of the earth!" He had in fact not exterminated Scriptures.
