In Numbers the 16th chapter, Moses and Aaron (the leaders of Israel selected by God) have their leadership publically challenged. The challengers are led by a man named Korah. The Bible says Korah and 250 leaders of the congregation stood against Moses and Aaron challenging their leadership (vs. 2-3). Later Moses sets forth a test to determine whom God has truly chosen (vs.5-7) in which God later proved it was Moses and Aaron while Korah and his people all died as the ground opened up under them. As you back up to verse 4, we see Moses' immediate response to the very public challenges and criticisms against his leadership. The Bible says, "When Moses heard this, he fell on his face". . . . Now, he did not trip and land on his face accidentally. Instead, it was purposefully, as an act of worship and reverence before God. Moses did not get all defensive and fire back at his critics instead he first turned to God. We don't know what he said or did exactly but judging from other times in his life (i.e., Num. 14) he very likely started praying for these people and for himself.

How many times do we hear negative comments, even down right mean and unjustified ones about ourselves (or those we love) and start praying for the ones who said it instead of defending ourselves? What would happen to us and for us (and others by extension) if every time we heard something bad about us (true or not) and/or even about others, we fell on our faces before the Lord and started praying for the ones who said it and the ones it was said about? Jesus said, we are to love our enemies (not fight with or rail against) and pray for (not plot our revenge) those who persecute us (Mt. 5:44). Are you falling on your face or screaming back at the face of someone else?

II Corinthians 4:4 The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.

Many reasons or excuses are given as to why an individual refuses at the moment to obey the gospel. In Scriptures, it is interesting to see so many people hear the gospel and immediately respond to the message. The Ethiopian eunuch is such an example. Others took some time, consideration and reasoning and then made the decision. Still others, immediately or after consideration, rejected the message. This verse states why unbelievers are unbelievers. This truth is one that most will not accept and yet it remains the truth. The reason people will not believe is due to the work of the god of this age. Who is the god of this age? It is none other than Satan. Satan is working to close minds. The seed that fell on the thorny ground also germinates and then is choked out. The seed is rooted out by worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth. Three of the four locations do not grow to maturity and produce a crop. These three are the workings of Satan. Let's always continue to give people the opportunity to hear the gospel. An open heart will accept the gospel and overcome the evil work of Satan.
