Last year South Gate participated in a service project headed up by Healing Hands International (HHI). This project called, The M.A.G.I. Project (i.e., Making A Godly Impact) focuses upon filling a box with gifts to be distributed to needy children in selected areas of the world around the Christmas holiday. Often these boxes are given to entire villages and these are the only gifts these children receive.

This year it is time to start this again. The dead line is October 1. This gives HHI time to sort and organize this project. Each year it has grown by the 1,000's. The boxes are provided and they only ask \$7.00 to be donated with each box to pay for the international shipping charges. While this may sound like a lot, none of us could ship this same package for this low price.

Here are some of the suggested items. A Bible, Toys (but no guns, knives, war-related items, etc. . .). No perishable food or anything that will melt (i.e., chocolate). Hygiene items: Soap, tooth brush, comb, wash cloth. Cloths: Underwear, socks, shirts and dresses. Candy: hard candy and gum in a zip lock bag. Personal notes without any email or addresses. Extras: Sun glasses, scarves, pony tail holders, bracelet's, earrings, etc. . .

School Supplies: Pencils, paper, crayons, etc. . .

It is so easy for each of us to take these things for granted. Through our combined efforts, we can each do our part to Make A Godly Impact in the lives of others.
