I Timothy 5:24 The sins of some men are obvious, reaching the place of judgment ahead of them; the sins of others trail behind them.

Some people are just evil. Their actions and attitudes are easily seen and understood. They are selfish, rebellious and hateful. Their evil is against man's laws as well as God's law. This type of person is one to avoid and may well be deserving of being removed from society by imprisonment or other actions. Think about Bible characters such as Jezebel, Manasseh, Cain or Judas Iscariot that were full of evil. Their sins included murder, theft, betrayal and idolatry. Their sins were well known and each deserved the punishment that came their way. These situations were easily seen but not all are that way. Some hide their sins well and they are kept secret from people.

Prostitution stings often catch politicians and even ministers that had been held in high esteem. It is sometimes possible to hide our sins from people but they will never be hidden from God. Scriptures declare, "Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account." Whether our sins are out in the open or hidden from people, we will face the judgment with God fully aware of all of our actions. Christians should strive to live holy lives but when sin enters we should confess them, repent of them and ask God for forgiveness. There will be no secrets on the judgment day.
