II Thessalonians 2:10 They perish because they refused to love the truth and so be saved.

In the short book of II Thessalonians, much is said of those who are lost. They will face judgment because of their opposition to God and his word. The first chapter deals with those that have opposed Christians and made them suffer. They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord. The second chapter talks of the coming man of lawlessness. He also will be doomed to destruction since he is doing the work of Satan.
