While reading through the gospels this month one thing that has stood out in my mind is Jesus' statements about the opportunities that were in front of His disciples to reach the Lost.

³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. ³⁵ Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. **John 4:34.35**

Jesus used the same phraseology when the seventy were sent out in **Luke 10:2**, and when he saw the crowds as sheep without a shepherd in **Matthew 9:36-38**. This caused my reflection on a few facts.

- I. Jesus sees a lost world as a field full of opportunities. We need to have eyes like Jesus.
- **II.** Jesus says we should pray for this effort. Specifically, for more workers for the harvest.

III. Jesus says the time to try to reach the lost is now!

After our bring a friend day we have an opportunity to follow up on the many opportunities that this special day brought to us. Lets not let these opportunities pass by. Follow up with those who visited. Ask them to continue to worship with us. Ask if they are interested in studying the Bible. What Are You Growing?

Hebrews 6:7-8 Land that drinks in the rain often falling on it and that produces a crop useful to those for whom it is farmed receives the blessing of God. But land that produces thorns and thistles is worthless and is in danger of being cursed. In the end it will be burned.

A plot of land can be used to grow crops. This will not happen by accident. A plan must be devised and allowed to run its course if a crop is to be realized. The farmer must have a method of turning the dirt over and prepare it to be planted. He must also decide what crop is to be grown. Soil tests should be run to find out if fertilizer is needed and if so, to what amount. The time comes to put the seed in the ground and the work is still not completed. The crop must be guarded against diseases, insects and weeds. With time and the God-given rain a crop will be produced. This true blessing then provides income or can be used as food. What happens to this very same piece of land if nothing is done with it? In a short time things can begin to grow that has no value to a person. It will quickly begin to produce thistles and a short time later briers and thorns. Eventually even trees may begin to grow and the ground no longer is suitable for planting. In days gone by the ground was set on fire to clear it. Today we would hire a bulldozer to clear it off and the pile of brush to be set on fire.

This passage is easily understood but in reality it is not talking about land but people. Are we cultivating our lives for the glory of God? Do we have a plan as to how we will strive to serve the Heavenly Father? On the other hand, do we simply ignore our soul and the need to please God? Our soul can become so overrun that we are far removed from Him. Is our soul producing a crop or thorns and thistles? Will our lives be receiving blessings or curses and fire? Develop your plan to serve God to the best of your ability and according to his will.
