Looking For a Sign

Mark 8:12 He sighed deeply and said, "Why does this generation ask for a miraculous sign? I tell you the truth, no sign will be given to it."

Mark eight recorded a remarkable instance of the lack of faith among some people. Jesus had just had a huge crowd in front of him listening to his message about the kingdom and righteous living. Many in the crowd had actually been with Jesus for a period of three days listening to his teaching. They were famished, not having eaten. Among the crowd seven loafs of bread as well as some small fish were found. Jesus took this small amount of food and used it to feed over four thousand people. Also, seven baskets of food were left over. How amazing! What a marvelous act! What man had ever done such a thing?

The Pharisees heard about this miracle. There were 4000 eyewitnesses and yet this was not satisfactory to them. They asked Jesus for a sign from heaven. They wanted evidence. What more could they want than what Jesus did? They heard of his miracles. They knew of his healings. Sadly, they were not convicted because they did not want to believe. Even today there is much evidence that Jesus was the Son of God. Many having heard of Jesus, read the Bible or heard it preached have believed. On the other hand, many have had the same opportunities and have decided they don't believe.

Jesus declared that no other sign would be given to the Pharisees. We know of one additional act that leaves us without excuse. Jesus died on the cross and rose again on the third day. There were many witnesses of this and this is further proof of Jesus being who he said he was. There will be no more signs. Will we simply accept the truth? It is a decision that each must make and this decision will affect our eternity.
