Knowing How To Answer. . . By Joe Macer

Colossians 4:6 Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

Knowing what to say and how to say it is so important to our human relationships. Words said appropriately will bring people closer to you whereas the same words used with a very different attitude will drive people away. Paul has just warned Christians to be wise in the way you act towards those who are not Christians. From today's verse, we learn that our speech plays an important role in our influence of others. Let's consider the three phrases found in this verse.

First, what we say is to be full of grace. What does this mean? The Christian's speech is to be kindly, courteous, pleasant, attractive, approachable and friendly. Our speech should not drive people away. It is not to be rude, vulgar, hateful, gloomy, pessimistic or depressing. When a person leaves our conversation, that persons should know that we care about them and are willing to help.

Second, our speech is to be seasoned with salt. Salt has always been used to make food more tasteful and as a preservative. Does our conversation draw people in or drive them away? Do our conversations preserve our relationships or terminate any future possibilities? Always use your words to keep the door open for future opportunities.

Third, know what you believe and why you believe it. If we don't know an answer to a question, admit it and go search for the answer. Then be sure to provide that information to the questioner. Ask God to give the wisdom of how to respond to various questions that will come our way. Ask for patience to deal with those with ulterior motives. People are watching us. May we always respond with grace, salt and knowledge.
