What Is A Sparrow Worth?... By Joe Macer

What is a Sparrow Worth? Matthew 10:29 Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from the will of your Father.

Sparrows are not exactly the most favorite of birds. They came to our land on ships long ago and large numbers now exist. They are not pretty and they are rather messy and most consider them a nuisance. Does anyone think a sparrow is worth a pile of money? Two sparrows were sold for one penny. The penny in this passage is the denarius of Biblical days. A soldier worked for a denarius per day. Some Biblical dictionaries place the worth at 15 to 20 cents. Others using today's prices would place its value at around fifty dollars. The purpose of this verse is to show that sparrows are not worth much. A second rendition of this thought is found in Luke 12:6. Here Jesus says that five sparrows are sold for two pennies. The fifth sparrow was free - worth nothing. This bird was important to God and God knew exactly what was happening to the bird.

The purpose of these two verses was to illustrate God's care and concern for man. Jesus said that man was worth many sparrows. Man has far more value than the birds. If God cares about a bird, then know that he cares even more deeply for man. As Jesus stated this, he understood that he would die for mankind. The God who knows the number of hairs on the head of a man showed the value of man by giving his only Son. Man was the highlight of God's creation and God desires having man living with him eternally. Thank God for all that he does for us. He gives us far more than we need and loves us far more than we deserve.
