Amos 5:19 It will be as though a man fled from a lion only to meet a bear, as though he entered his house and rested his hand on the wall only to have a snake bite him.

Amos had a message of judgment for Israel. They have been warned often and by various men of God. Amos described judgments of foreign invaders, fire, drought, mildew and locusts as well as other judgments. Sin was the reason for these judgments and yet God was willing to relent if they would just turn back to him. How did Israel respond? Israel lived as if they did not believe it. They did not change their ways. The Day of the Lord - a day of judgment would come. Amos drove this point home with today's verse. Imagine a man who came across a lion and he fled from it only to run into a bear. He runs from it and just barely makes it into his house and thinks he is safe. In his home, he rests against the wall and a snake in his house bites him. There was no escape. Judgment had arrived.
