Lessons Learned

Ephesians 4:11,12 And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, 12 for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ;

This week I want to continue to share with you lessons I've learned at Horizons Future Church Leaders Workshop. One of the biggest lessons I have learned is that everyone needs to develop their abilities to serve the Lord. I believe that a congregation that is not purposefully developing leaders will soon run out of them. That is why Paul tells us that God expects us to be about the work of "equipping saints for the work of service". When we are focused on this task we will be actively developing future leaders.

For too long many congregations have hired one person to do all their teaching, visiting, and ministering. Not only does this hinder the development of future leaders, it will also limit the growth of the church. It is unscriptural for a church to think they can hire out their God given work or their hope for future leadership. This is a plan to fail.

Leadership will not develop on accident. Every disciple needs encouragement along these lines. As a church, we must focus on whatever we do asking the question "Will this successfully train future leaders?" We need men to see the need of the church for effective hard working deacons and to aspire to fill that role. We need deacons who are striving to develop the qualities found in I Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5 so they can serve as elders. Our elders must continually look for ways to better their God given responsibility to care for the members of the church. I hope we will all focus on developing leaders to the best of our ability and that God will bless our efforts to that end.

Am I One of the Few?

Matthew 22:14 For many are invited but few are chosen.

Matthew 22 begins with the parable of the wedding banquet. Jesus uses this story to teach a concept about his kingdom. People had been invited to the wedding banquet but they refused to come. More individuals were then sent out to invite other people to come to the banquet. These also refused and went about their daily activities ignoring the opportunity. On this second occasion some of the recipients of the invitation were so upset that they mistreated the servants and killed some of them. The king then sent his army and these murderers were killed. Once more the servants were sent out with the invitation to come to the banquet. Many did come to the banquet and enjoyed the meal. The conclusion of the story was, "For many are invited but few are chosen."

The gospel of Jesus is an invitation to all men to enter the kingdom of God. Some will go about their everyday activities and ignore the invitation. Others will become violent after receiving the invitation. They think that by destroying the messenger that the message will be removed. They will receive the wrath of God Others will accept the invitation and show up at the banquet and enjoy a feast. What percentage of people invited actually enjoyed the meal? No definite answer is given but we are told that few were chosen. The most important decision in life is our answer to this invitation. Am I one of the few? Am I helping others to learn of the invitation? Let's all make the effort to answer the call to be one of the few.
