Ezekiel 33:7-9 "So you, son of man, I have made a watchman for the house of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. 8. If I say to the wicked, O wicked one, you shall surely die, and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way, that wicked person shall die in his iniquity, but his blood I will require at your hand. 9. But if you warn the wicked to turn from his way, and he does not turn from his way, that person shall die in his iniquity, but you will have delivered your soul.

In the first six verses of this chapter God tells Ezekiel about the responsibility given to a watchman. His job was to warn the people of the land. If the people ignored the warning of the watchman their blood would be on their own head, but if the watchman failed to give the warning he would be help accountable for their death. God used this obvious illustration to lead to a spiritual truth.

He then reveals God's desire for the house of Israel to be a source of warning for those around them. They were expected to give warning to those around them just as a watchman would warn a city about an upcoming attack. They had a responsibility to warn others about spiritual dangers in this world. If their warnings were ignored they would not be held accountable, but if they failed to give God's warning then the blood of those who went unwarned would be required at their hand.

What about us? Are we faithfully fulfilling the duty of a watchman to those around us, or are we silently standing by as they are destroyed by sin and Satan's army. Lets make sure we are faithfully standing guard for those around us.

What Shall We Do?

Matthew 23:3 So you must obey them and do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach.

Often in Jesus' ministry he had stinging words for the Pharisees. The 23rd chapter of Matthew records many of the strong warnings he had for these individuals. In reality, the people of that day looked up to the Pharisees for leadership and religious instruction. There were serious problems in looking to the Pharisees and this is what Jesus was addressing in this chapter. In the future weeks, we will look at the seven woes pronounced by the Lord. The introductory remarks by the Lord are centered on their leadership.

Leadership is to pass on instructions. At the same time, the leadership is to set the example for those they are leading. The Pharisees knew what the Mosaical law taught. They knew the rules and regulations and were willing to pass it on to those around them. Jesus clearly tells the crowds that they were to obey the teachings of the Pharisees. There was a huge problem though. The Pharisees said one thing but did something else. They taught the proper way to observe the Sabbath but did not do so themselves. They taught against stealing but did it in various ways. They talked about honoring God but failed to do so themselves.

Jesus said to do what they taught but not to do what they did. They did not practice what they taught.

Do we practice what we preach? Do we do what we teach our children to do? Does the boss do what he expects the employees to do? Do elders and ministers set the example that they ask the members to do? Chapter 23 is for self inspection. How are you starting?
