August Parenting Class

As I spend time this week preparing for our parenting class, I am taken back by the task at hand. I don't know any work that is more challenging, humbling, and rewarding than trying to raise children to serve the Lord. It has often been said the only ones who have all the answers about raising children are those who don't have them. I feel underqualified for the job as I struggle daily with wondering what is best for my children. I believe this is a common struggle for all parents, and I hope our class can help us take a serious look at this question.

Scripture tells fathers to bring up our children "in the training and admonition of the Lord Ephesians 6:4." This is easy to say and hard to do. It will not happen on accident, and I believe fathers need a lot of help in completing this command. It takes many people focusing on the spiritual development of a child to for him or her to become a real disciple of Jesus Christ.

In this passage we see two things that young people need. Let's consider the first one. Paul said to train them. Notice, he did not say tell them. There is a difference in telling and training. Telling means I told them right thing to do, while training means I helped them to learn how to do the right thing. When you are training someone they get to practice the desired activities while being given the guidance that will help them succeed. Training takes patience, a steady hand, and constant redirection. As parents and as a congregation I hope we will all think about what we can do to help train or support the training of our young people to successfully follow the Lord.

The First Woe

Matthew 23:13 Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You shut the kingdom of heaven in men's faces. You yourselves do not enter, nor will you let those enter who are trying to.

The Lord and his apostles often commended good and godly leaders. Faithful elders were worthy of double honor. Elders are pictured as receiving the crown of gold when the Chief Shepherd appears. Faithful Christians will receive the right to eat of the tree of life, authority over the nations, a crown, the New Jerusalem and they will walk with the Lord. However not all leaders are doing what the Lord considers faithful. The religious leaders of Jesus' day were the teachers of the law and the Pharisees. Jesus had a very stern warning for them that applies even to this day.

These leaders claimed to help people. Their leadership may have increased their morals, helped them to overcome some problems, calmed their emotions, and possibly improved their relationships with people but they were leading them down the path to destruction. These men pretended to know God, to speak for God and to know how to be part of the kingdom. The truth is they knew none of this. The Lord pictured them standing in front of a gate to God's kingdom and preventing people from entering. They did not know what they were talking about. The sad fact is they were standing outside blocking the gate and did not realize they were outside. This first woe is a strong warning to accept Jesus as the Messiah. The words of Jesus must be followed and obeyed. This verse calls upon us today to examine ourselves. Are we really a part of the kingdom? Are we preventing anyone from entering the kingdom? Let's take seriously this warning from the Lord.
