Setting Up Stones

As parents there are so many challenges. We are challenged by hectic schedules, the diversity found in our children, and the ever present question of "should we be doing all of this or just spend more time at home. We feel unqualified to deal with the new challenges our children face that we never experienced. This is all happening in a society that is becoming more and more worldly. How to raise a faithful child is one of the most important tasks of any parent, but there are many obstacles to accomplishing this task and we need help. As the Lord's body at South Gate I want us to consider this question, "What can we do as a congregation to help our young people remain faithful?"

In Joshua 4 God stops the Jordan river to allow the Israelites to enter the promised land. As they are crossing the river He tells them to gather 12 stones out of the bottom of the river and to set them up as a memorial. In verses 21 and 22 God tells Israel this, *"When your children ask their fathers in times to come, 'What do these stones mean?'* 22 then you shall let your children know, 'Israel passed over this Jordan on dry ground.' Here we see that God wanted adults to do something that would help future generations to have faith in him. He knew by taking this action children would later ask the question "What do these stones mean?" This would give the adults the opportunity to tell their children about the God they serve.

This is a great example of doing things with the next generation's faith in mind. We need to set up stones that our children will see and ask about our God. As a congregation we must focus not only on our faith, but also on the faith of our children. I hope each one of us will ask the question. "What am I doing to pass on faith to the next generation?" I am so glad that my children can look at the Bible bowl, VBS, tweens, youth for Christ, church camps, and our student ministry and have the opportunity to consider our God and what He has done to make our trip to the promised land possible.

The Second Woe

Matthew 23:15 Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You travel over land and sea to win a single convert, and when he becomes one, you make him twice as much a son of hell as you are.

One thing is for certain. The scribes and the Pharisees were dedicated to their teachings. When they taught a particular way of serving God, they were convinced that everyone needed to do as they taught. When they decided their understanding of a Scripture, they believed everyone should understand it the same way. Dedication to their concepts caused them to travel over land and sea. They would travel a great distance and at great expense to present their views to anyone who would listen. During their journey or door to door in the city or to the shipmates they traveled with they saw each individual as a prospect. Jesus is not condemning their enthusiasm for proclaiming their message. He is condemning their message.

Once again these individuals are called hypocrites. They were looking for individuals who join them in their party line of thinking. Their converts were converted to human opinion rather than the true word of God. Pharisees exalted their opinions over Scriptures. Their converts were converted to the Pharisee philosophy and the Pharisee philosophy would not save them. Sadly they found converts and these individuals fell into the same unsaved category. The message for us today is to make converts who are converted to God's word. We fail ourselves and our converts if they are simply converted to our philosophy. Let's search for those seeking to obey God and let's make sure they are converted to God and nothing more.
