When to Sow Seed

Ecclesiastes 11:6 Sow your seed in the morning, and at evening let not your hands be idle, for you do not know which will succeed, whether this or that, or whether both will do equally well.

Most all of us have planted a garden at one time or another. What approach do you take to having plenty? Do you plant just one or two tomato plants or many? Last year we planted twelve rows of potatoes and had enough to last us through March and some small ones for seed. This year we planted almost as much but got far fewer potatoes and they were much smaller. We do not know how our crops will turn out when we plant them. Solomon issues a warning to not be lazy. Plant your crops in the morning, in the evening and whenever you can. One may succeed and the other may fail but you still have food. Both may succeed and you may have an abundance which we could surely share with those in need. The important point that Solomon is making is to give your best and do not waste your time and opportunities.

Let's consider this thought from the viewpoint of the church. Spreading the gospel is spreading seed. The more opportunities that we take to plant the seed the greater the increase. A radio ad this week made the statement that all people around the world know about Coke. The message has been spread and all Islamic countries are drinking it. Then why does not all the world know about Christ? Perhaps as Christians we have not given our very best but have been idle when some opportunities could have been used to teach about our Lord. The church must try as many ways as possible to inform the world about Jesus. One way may succeed while the other may fail but any conversion that takes place will save a soul from hell. How much planting are you doing?
