5 Tips for Focused Bible Study

In our parenting class we are discussing the importance of making the study of scripture a priority in the life of our young people. As we all know, a study of God's will is a vital part of any faithful walk with Him. Here are a few suggestions of what you can do when we come together to make our worship service and Bible study more effective.

Make sure you have your Bible with you. A soldier with no sword is at a distinct disadvantage.

Always turn to every scripture that is mentioned. Remember the Christians in Berea (Acts 17:11). You will remember more when you hear it and see it. You may also want to make a note for future reflections.

When you are in a class or series make notes about what you can read before coming to class/ worship. A larger context is always nice in any study of God's word.

Read and reread scriptures. I have loved reading the sermon on the mount time and again and again this year. It continues to unfold in depth and application. The Psalmist tells us there is value in meditating on it day and night (Psalm 1:2). Try focusing on the same chapter everyday for a week and see what it does for your heart.

Make sure you read it with a heart to act on it. James 1:22 tells us to make sure we are not only putting into our heart but into our actions. If we do this he says we will be blessed in what we do.

I pray that every action at South Gate is always based on a faithful study of God's revealed word for it is the only foundation that will last. If our lives are being built on His teachings we will be able to weather any storm and will be waiting for Him when He returns. Lord come quickly!!!

The Fourth Woe

Matthew 23:23 Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a tenth of your spices - mint, dill and cummin. But you neglected the more important matters of the law - justice, mercy and faithfulness.

One of the expectations of the Israelites was to tithe. They gave a tenth of everything. One of ten calves, one of ten lambs and one of ten pieces of silver were given to God. Many of the religious leaders gave a tenth of their spices although this was not specifically stated in the law. Mint, dill and cummin all produce a very small seed. While most people would not consider the production of herbs as income, these Pharisees made sure to separate one tenth of the tiny seeds into a pile in order to give it to the treasury of Israel. These men were very conscientious about their giving but lacking on so much more.

Jesus said they neglected justice, mercy and faithfulness. These qualities were to be exhibited by faithful followers of the law. Instead they were unkind, greedy, unforgiving and abusive towards others. Specific commands were presented in Scriptures concerning these qualities but they were ignored. Their practices were twisted. Jesus said, "You strain out a gnat but swallow a camel." The gnat was the smallest unclean insect while the camel was the largest of the unclean animals. Some Pharisees would suck their drinks through the gaps in their teeth in order to strain out the gnat but if humanly possible they would have swallowed a whole camel. The insignificant was magnified whereas the important was minimized or completely ignored. Jesus' warning to the Pharisees is also a warning for us today. Let's strive to do all that the Lord has commanded us.
