The Amalekites attacked the Israelites at Rephidim. Moses told Joshua to gather some men to go to battle against the Amalekites. Moses would go to the top of a hill with the staff of God in his hands. He was calling upon God to help his people to overcome this enemy. Joshua got the battle going while Moses, Aaron and Hur climbed the hill. As long as Moses held his hands up in the air, the Israelites were winning the battle.
