Revelation 19:1 After this I heard what sounded like the roar of a great multitude in heaven shouting: "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God,

What comes to your mind when you hear the word salvation? This beautiful thought is one of the themes of Revelation. Men and women who had faced persecution and yet they had found salvation. The expression of joy is found in this verse as well as many others in this book. Peter talked quite often about salvation. In fact, the New Testament is about Jesus coming to this earth in order to provide salvation. The book of Acts talks about the beginning of the church and the process of salvation. Other books talk about it and warn against ignoring it.

Mark records the words of Jesus: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." Two choices are possible for each person. Either we have salvation or we have condemnation. Salvation means to be with God. Salvation means to avoid the torments of hell. Salvation means to be victorious over sin and the evils of this world. Salvation means to have eternal life.

Scriptures inform us that today is the day of salvation. If you have not accepted God's plan for salvation, then why not do it today. Acceptance must take place in this lifetime and we are never assured of tomorrow. If you have accepted this gift of salvation, then thank God for this marvelous act of grace given through his Son. May salvation always be upon our minds and hearts.
