Nehemiah 4:6 So we built the wall. And all the wall was joined together to half its height, for the people had a mind to work.

Luke 13:2 Jesus answered, "Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way?

When we look around us there are many warnings for us in life. In Jesus' day some people began to talk with him about some Galileans who were killed by Pilate. He asked if they were the worst of sinners because this happened to them. The answer was no. Jesus then asked them about 18 men that died when the tower of Siloam fell on them. Were they the most guilty of sinners? Is this why they died? Once again the answer is no. One group died due to the inhumanity of man and one group died from an accident. They were not the worst people. In fact, there may have been some very good men in each group. What then were they and us to learn from this account?
