Malachi 2:17 You have wearied the Lord with your words. "How have we wearied him?" you ask. By saying, "All who do evil are good in the eyes of the Lord, and he is pleased with them" or "Where is the God of justice?"

Things spoken against within the Scriptures have been twisted so that people now proclaim the Bible has been misunderstood and evil behavior is acceptable. The human mind somehow always manages to invent ways to say my behavior is fine with God. God grows tired with this type of thinking. He has clearly revealed his will and he expects and demands that we conform to his will. Is there a sin in your life that you are trying to justify? If so, it is time to repent and simply do as God demands.

The second is to accuse God of injustice. Atheists as well as some Christians blame God for all the evil in this world. If you will listen, you will hear people and all forms of media claiming God is not fair. God grows weary hearing such things. These accusations against God are unfounded and actually an insult towards God. These types of comments weary God. Have you said anything like this?
