Jesus wanted growth

Matthew 28:18-20 And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

This week on Sunday we will discuss the growth of the New Testament church. The reason for it's growth was multifaceted, but the command for growth was clear. Jesus wanted his church to grow. He wanted more disciples. He wanted them to experience the forgiveness of sins that comes through obedience in baptism, and he wanted them to continue to grow as disciples through observing His commands. As He gave this directive he ended with a promise, "lo, I am with you always even to the end of the age."

His followers heard this command and gave their life to fulfilling it. They must have repeated this command to make disciples time and again because they constantly did what they could to make this happen. The question for us is "How well are we following the Lord's command to make disciples?" How bad do you want the Lord's church to grow? What are you willing to do to help someone else become a disciple of Jesus Christ? Let's all commit to the growth of the Lord's church and take confidence in the fact that He is with us as we do His will.

Wrestling in Prayer

Colossians 4:12 Epaphras, who is one of you and a servant of Jesus Christ, sends greetings. He is always wrestling in prayer for you, that you may stand firm in all the will of God, mature and fully assured.

Not much is known of this man call Epaphras. Many Bible characters have a great deal of information written about them. With the little recorded about this man we can learn some important lessons. First, Paul said he was one of you. He was just like any Christian in Colosse. There are certain expectations of all Christians. Epaphras met these expectations and was striving to follow God's will. We don't have to be someone special to serve God. We can simply fit in with the rest of God's children. The second declaration about Epaphras is that he is a servant. This man served God and he served God's people. He desired that all Christians do what God expected of them. He was more than willing to help people live a Christian life. We would do well to just simply be a Christian and to serve God and fellow Christians in every way possible.

The third statement about Epaphras is that he is always wrestling in prayer. Christians are to be people of prayer. Specifically, he prayed that the members of the local congregation stand firm in all the will of God. Some Christians want to pick and choose what to do in order to serve God. He prayed that these friends would do all of God's will. He also prayed that they would mature. God's people should always be growing. Third he prayed that his brothers and sisters would be fully assured. Christians can sometimes feel unworthy. Some wonder how God could really save them. Epaphras prayed often concerning these ideas. He actually wrestled with these thoughts in prayer. How much do we pray for our brothers and sisters? Do we have great concern for all those serving God?
