Dear ones,

Greetings from Athens. Our earnest prayer is that this newsletter finds all you doing well and being safe from the Covid19.

After 2 very difficult months of lockdown our government has decided, with some restrictions still, to allow the people to go back to their normal life and all business to start reopening. These two lockdown months have caused many problems to all families and it will take lots of time for things to go back, if they ever do. It seems life will not be the same again. However the lockdown reason has been very successful in Greece which is probably the safest EU country with less than 2700 people getting sick and 168 dead because of Covid19 in total. So, all in all the lockdown time was worth it.

Of course the economic damage is big as everywhere, but the government has done a good job so far helping individuals and business, and we hope that by the end of this year things will be good again, provided there will not be a second Covid19 wave.

Church member's condition

This pandemic has been a disaster in almost every area. None of the church or family members has been sick or died because of the virus, but the economic disaster has effected all church members to the point that their present condition is far worse than the one during the hard austerity times. Unemployment is close to 95%, and the few who may can find a part time job once a week consider themselves fortunate. We do not know how to face this, but to pray that it will not last for long. In the meantime we continue to pray and trust in the Lord, that He will take through this new ordeal victoriously. In the meantime the church provides and helps those in need.

Church services

The church work has been influenced in every way. Since the beginning of the lockdown our services and Bible Studies have been canceled and , based on the government restriction we won't be allowed to reopen the church building before June 7th. We have been using the ZOOM app for church services. Our coworker Beni Leka from Nashville TN is the host of the Sunday Greek



services, our coworker in Athens Peter Ozah the host of the English services, and myself with a Greek brother are taking in charge of the Wednesday evening class and the Friday evening Ladies class. We are thankful technology has helped the brethren to study and meet together until we are allowed to meet again at the church building. The Ministry of Religion has send me, being the official minister of the church, that any violation of the law about the church meetings restrictions, would cause me personally a 6.000 euro fine and 3 months imprisonment.

Hopefully we will soon get the green light to start again services and home Bible studies..


Prison ministry

He has lost all memory and cannot control feelings and actions. His condition is tragic and worsens every day. He is the husband of our sister Magiola, age 38, who is still recovering from a recent hip surgery. They have 2 boys ages 19 & 15. Mata and I stand by and help them as much as possible in every way. All the brethren pray fervently for them.
